## 1.0 Introduction

Program inception marks the start of the community engagement activities of the Fair Water Futures HF Main 2. This activity which was done from 18 – 227 May 2021, aimed at introducing the program to the local government authorities, like-minded stakeholders, and the beneficiary communities who are smallholder farmers, livestock keepers, and fish folks in Kilosa and Kilombero districts. Sub activities included (i) conduct the program inception meeting with the district executive directors (DED), (ii) program introduction meetings with community members including smallholder farmers, ,pastoralists, and fisherfolks and their local government leaders, (iii) - recruitment of water witnesses (Mashahidi) from each of targeted livelihoods group, and (iv) assessment of the water security challenges and access opportunities as well as climate change related impacts affecting farmers, fisherfolks and pastoralists.

## 2.0 Field team

This activity as conducted by the SwM program team in cooperation with the Kilosa and Kilombero district officers related to agriculture, fisheries, and livestock keeping activities and basin water boards.

## 3.0 Inception Meetings

### 3.1. At District Executive Director (DED)

The team reported at the DEDs' office and had warm welcome from the acting officers. On top of the information presented in team's visit notification letter sent a week before, the team led by program manager spent few minutes explaining to the director the nature and design, objectives, expected activities and outcomes, the target groups of beneficiaries, and stakeholders of our Uhakika wa Maji program phase II. Both directors were impressed by the work of SwM on catalysing the social accountability for equitable water resource security, access, and management to attain the wellbeing for all in Kilosa district.

### 3.2. Courtesy call at Kilombero District Commissioner's (DC) office

The team had a chance to introduce the project to the DC and the District Administrative Secretary at Kilombero. However, the DCs concern was for the project to have tangible benefits for the communities, emphasizing that Kilombero's communities need water supply facilities and not just research and capacity building.

### 3.3. Awareness Meeting and Recruitment of Mashahidi

#### 3.3.1. Meeting with Farmers at Chanzuru village - Kilosa

A meeting with farmers at Chanzuru village was held on Tuesday 18<sup>th</sup> May 2021. It was attended by 53 farmers including village leaders. After clear understanding of the project, 15 farmers volunteered and registered to be Mashahidi while others were selected by fellows.



Various issues related to water resource access were raised by farmers as follows.

- Ilonga river which is the only source of water for the two (Chanzuru and Ilonga) irrigation schemes has been degraded with increased unsustainable human activities especially in the upstream. This has contributed to a decreased in the flow of water to meet the demand. Farmers are worried the river might fail to serve their livelihood over the next ten years and therefore responsible authorities should work on the problem.
- Majority of farmers are irresponsible for the management of the scheme leading to destruction of the structure due to increased silting problem.
- Some indiscipline farmers especially men and big farmers illegally drain too much water from the channels into their fields at night violating the set schedules among members of the irrigation association.
- Pastoralists have been feeding their cattle in farming fields and destroying the irrigation canal.

- Drought conditions were discussed by participants as the major climate challenge affecting the area with high frequency as compared to flooding. But recently, flooding in Mkondoa river have had some negative effects in the village;
- There is inefficient water use due to poor infrastructure and inadequate management of the scheme. no monitoring of water use, the scheme has not renewed its water right and there are not paying for water use.
- The association is regally registered and has a constitution. There is hope for improvement in O&M following a recent change in leadership which includes overseeing enforcement of the constitution.

#### Observation of the irrigation scheme structure

To verify the water issues discussed during the program introduction meeting, the team, guided by the chairperson of the irrigation association, visited the Chanzuru irrigation scheme. We learnt the silting problem and poor management. It was observed that the river has been completely blocked to serve farming activities in Chanzuru and Ilonga only without considering the need for water by other communities in the downstream and the environment.



#### 3.3.2. Meeting with Pastoralists – Mbwade village, Kilosa

This meeting between the program team and 23 representatives (see annex 2) of the Maasai pastoralists association in Mbwade village was conducted on Wednesday 19<sup>th</sup> May 2021. This village was selected as a new case for studying and advocating for the water access and use issues for livestock keeping activity in cooperation with Mashahidi in Kilosa district. After the intensive elaboration of the program, some participants volunteered and were directly accepted by the colleagues to be Mashahidi. Others were chosen by members to make a total of 15 Mashahidi (Annex 1).



#### Water access and use issues raised in the meeting

- Too much livestock kept compared to the water resources available in the village increases the stress. The village depend on only two cattle troughs built to serve all cattle in the village which are significantly not enough especially during dry season; as no water flows in Mgombelenga river (Ilonga) during dry season due to abstraction in the upstream mainly Ilonga & Chanzuru irrigation schemes.

- Establishment of big farming estates by rich people has denied the right to water and grazing land in areas around their village. It has become even difficult to find routes to pass their cattle in search for water and pasture until they bribe. One of the participants said,  
*“We have to contribute and raise certain amount of money to bribe farmers so as to pass our cattle to Mtafuteni area where pasture and water is found in plenty”*
- The alternative solutions they have to these challenges are sometimes to migrate cattle in the neighbour areas. But this has never been the best option as they always face strong resistance and conflicts from farmers;
- In certain periods of the year, the cattle died due to drought conditions and severe water scarcity;
- Members of the livestock keepers in this village contribute Tshs 20 daily per cow at the water troughs to the water committee, but it seems funds management is poor. Much money is collected but the management of the troughs and plans for construction of new ones are not in place;
- There is a pastoralists association but has not been active in resolving water issues due to lack of awareness on related policy and laws.
- Livestock keepers association in this village does not pay water-user fees to the Wami-Ruvu bonde and hence illegally using water for their cattle;

#### Observation of the Water trough structures

Guided by the vice chairperson of the livestock keepers’ association (Mr. Mselem Kandili), the team visited one water trough to learn and witness the situation of the infrastructures. The trough is modernized as water is pumped by electric motors. The troughs were constructed under the support of the iWASH project by USAID. It was noted that a lot of money is collected from members of the association which can be used to maintain the structures as well as constructing the new ones. But it seems there is a challenge in the management of collected funds.



#### 3.3.3. Meeting with Farmers – Sululu village, Ifakara

This meeting was conducted on May 25<sup>th</sup>, 2021, at the village government’s office where few farmers attended. The project was clearly explained by the team and farmers we thankful to receive it. Due to low attendance, participants promised to have their own meeting with more farmers specially to spread the message and select Mashahidi, and the list to be submitted to the program manager in the following week.



#### Key issue raised by farmers in this meeting

Participants in this meeting raised the following issues affecting their livelihoods and would like to see them addressed by the project.

- Insufficient water for irrigation especially during dry season.
- Deteriorating scheme infrastructure caused by inadequate follow up and maintenance as well as reckless use of the scheme by farmers. For instance, farmers do not comply to farming 60 meters from the bank of the river, hence degrading the environment.
- Lack of awareness on various policies and laws governing water resources management and governance.
- Powerful farmers to utilize more water than others,
- There have been notable changes in rainfall seasons causing delays in the onsets and early cessation. Sometimes flooding occurs but has no negative impacts to the community.

#### *3.3.4. Meeting with Pastoralists -Lungongole village, Ifakara*

The meeting happened on the following day Wednesday 26<sup>th</sup> May 2021 at the village government's office. Participants included livestock keepers whom majority are Sukuma by tribe. The team in cooperation with district officers and hydrologist from the Rufiji Basin Water Board explained about the project and expected results if all stakeholders contribute fully to the activities. Some participants raised concerns which were elaborated by the team and officers. At the end of the meeting, recruitment of 16 Mashahidi was successfully done (Annex 1)



#### Key issues raised during this meeting

Water related issues affecting livestock keeping in this pastoralist community include;

- Lack of water infrastructure for cattle. The entire community depends on the only natural dam called Mkombei,
- Serious conflict between irrigation farmers and pastoralists on the use of Mkombei dam. Pastoralists claim that the dam was designated for cattle during the village Land use planning.
- Livestock keepers are worried of the expanding sugar farming by Kilombero sugar company which could completely swallow grazing field.

- Illegal fishing activities contribute to the degradation of the dam.
- Livestock keepers are completely unaware of the various laws and regulations governing water resources use and management,
- The population of cattle is increasing rapidly due to immigrants from Ulanga district. This keeps complicating the situation of water and grazing land availability.

### ***3.3.5. Meeting with Fisherfolks – Fish folks camp, Kivukoni***

This meeting was held on Thursday 26<sup>th</sup> May 2021 at the fish folks’ camp (Kivukoni) in Lipangalala ward of the Ifakara town. It was one of the most successful meeting attended by many smallholder fishermen. In the first place, fisherfolks were worried about us thinking we could be the government officials coming to enforce some fishing restrictions. But after listening to the Uhakika wa Maji program objectives and expected results, they were very happy and many volunteered to be Mashahidi (Annex 1). They became cooperative enough to air-out all their fishing challenges within the Kilombero river.



#### **Key issues raised**

Some key challenges facing this poor community as discussed in this meeting are.

- Strict and unfair fishing laws and tariffs imposed by the Tanzania Wildlife Authority (TAWA) and the district authority have made their livelihood difficulty. They have been allocated with small area for fishing which has no breeding sites. They have also been prohibited from conducting fishing at night.
- Illegal fishing usually conducted by powerful fish folks and irresponsible farming activities along the riverbanks are seriously degrading the river environments as well as deteriorating the breeding sites.
- The herds of cattle have been increasing every day within the river environments and this has badly affected the nature and causing siltation.
- Lack of fishermen’s formal association has been weakening their voices to the responsible authorities.
- Limited legal literacy has been denying them some water use and access rights.
- For them river flooding during rainy season is not a problem because they get enough fish from the river.

## **4.0 Conclusion**

Generally, the activity has been successfully executed and its deliverables achieved. The project has been very well understood and gained strong acceptance from various stakeholders including the local government and basin boards authorities, politicians, as well as the communities. Joining the team with government officers from Kilosa and Kilombero district councils has been advantageous as it attracts the attention and support next activities. For better achievement in the next community engagement meeting, pre-planning, and contracting with participants should be given priority to ensure adequate attendance from the target audience.

## 5.0 Next steps

SwM and involved communities and stakeholders pledged maximum cooperation on this project. It was informed that recruited Mashahidi from all cases will be gathered for an intensive training in few weeks to come. The district authorities promised full support of the program and designated officers related to agricultural extension, fisheries, and livestock keeping being our program focal persons for every activity.
